### Section Notes:

- Eggs will be displayed on plates provided by the Society;
- White Eggs means only eggs that are white (pale beige and tinted pastel are not white);
- Brown eggs means any kind of brown – soft tan to dark chocolate colour;
- Blue eggs can include green eggs as they stem from the same blue gene
- Tinted eggs are any natural colour shell other than white or brown (including pink, pink-brown, green, specked);
- No decorations on eggs. Eggs will be on display for the duration of the show.
- Unless specifically requested, the Society will dispose of eggs after the show. **Exhibitors who wish to collect their exhibits must make prior arrangements with the hall steward;**
- Eggs will be judged on both external and internal characteristics:-
  - Externally the eggs will be judged on uniformity of size, shape colour, shell texture and appearance;
  - Internal judging will consider the yolk, albumen, chalaza, air space and freshness.
